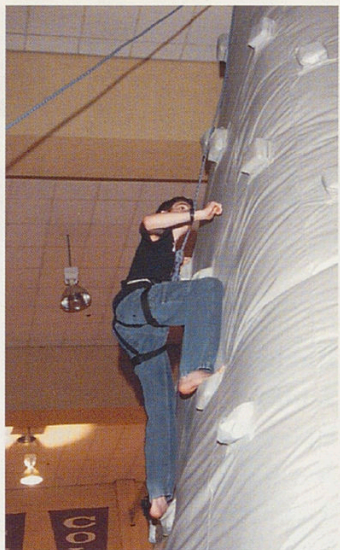

## Students learn to 'Arrive Alive'

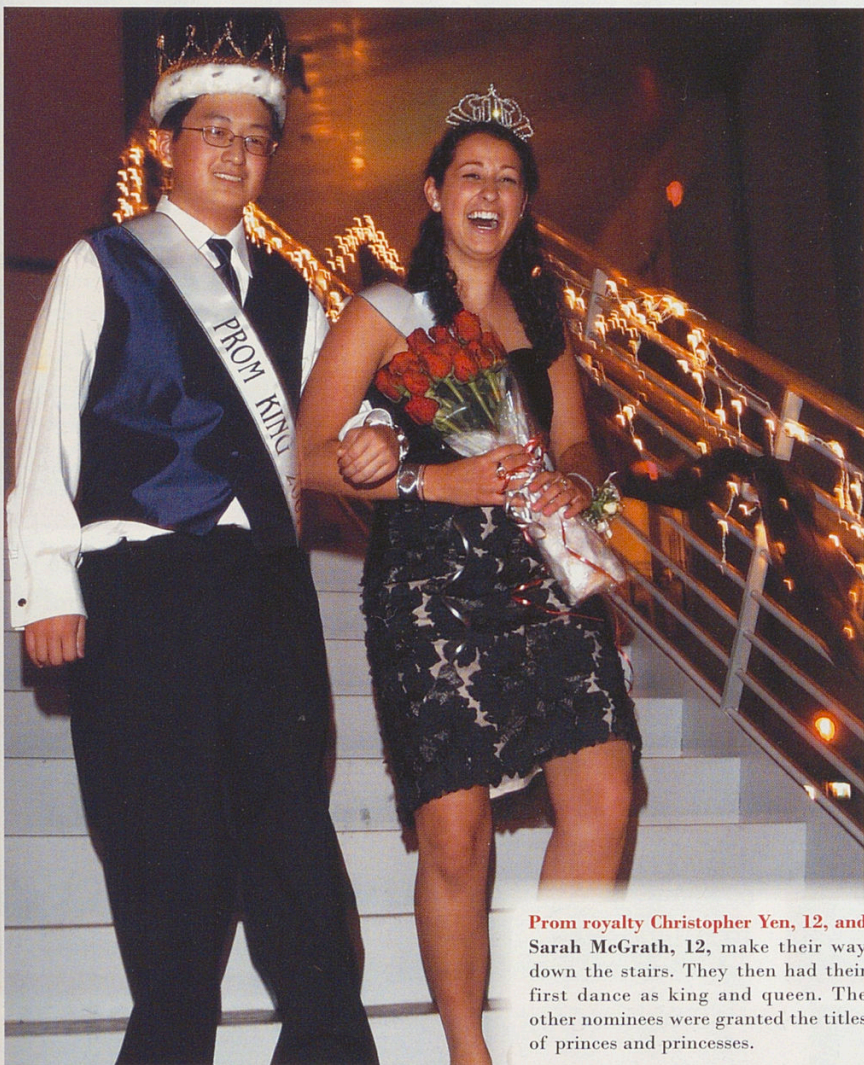
Although prom was supposed to be all about having an enjoyable time, students were reminded to be safe on the big night.

The point of the assembly was to further educate students on the true affects of driving while drunk.

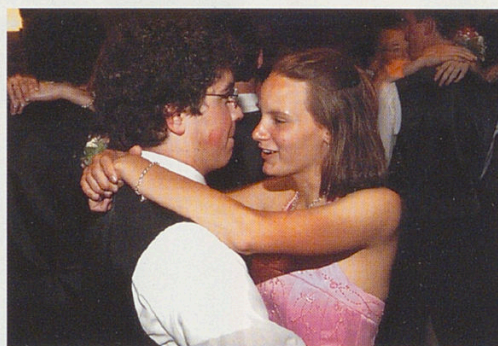
