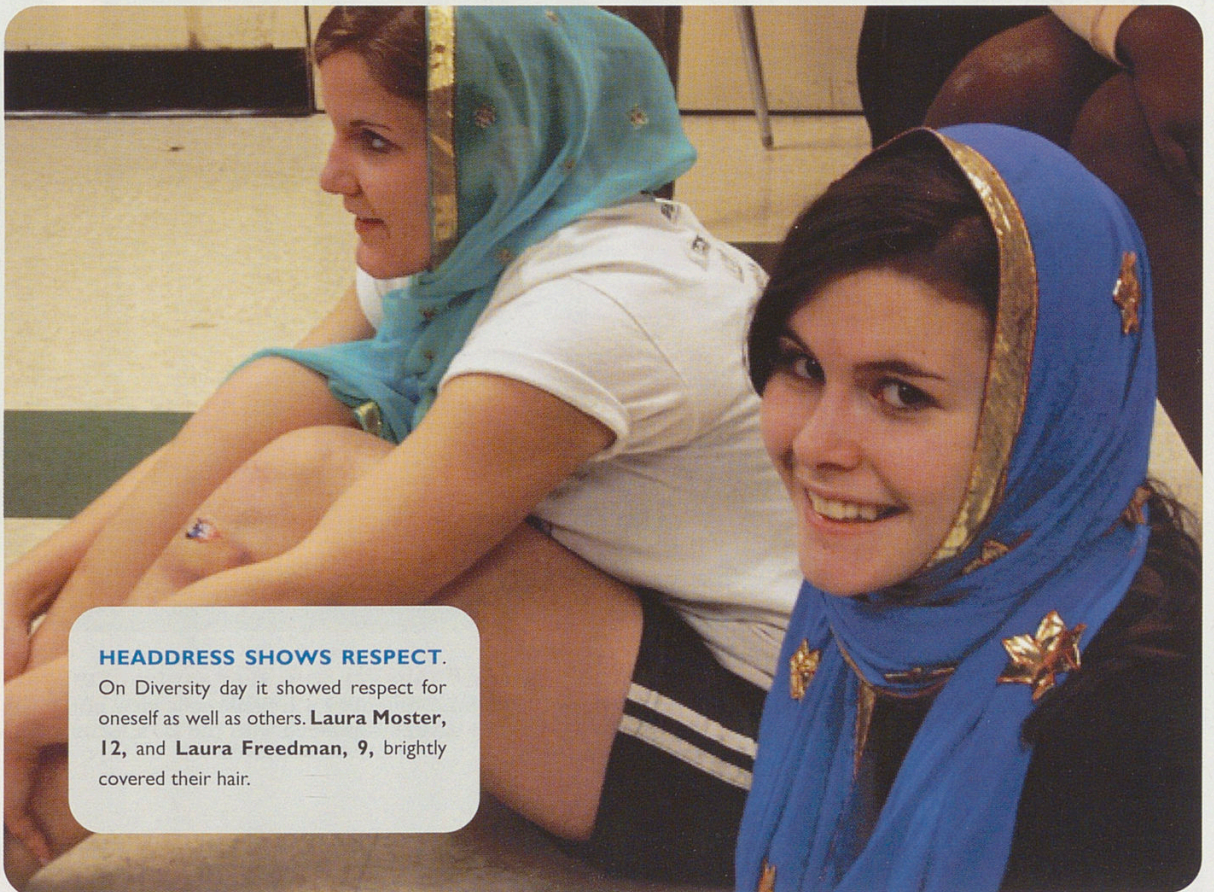
HENNA ON THE HAND, AND DIVERSITY ON THE MIND. **SARA KAUFMAN,**
