

**ORIGAMI!** Japanese Club held meetings after school to plan for Deck the Halls. During meetings members contributed by making origami to hang in the halls.



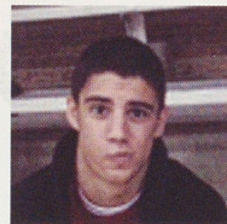

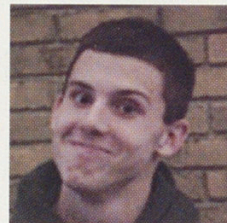
