"It was definitely a challenge coaching so many girls."

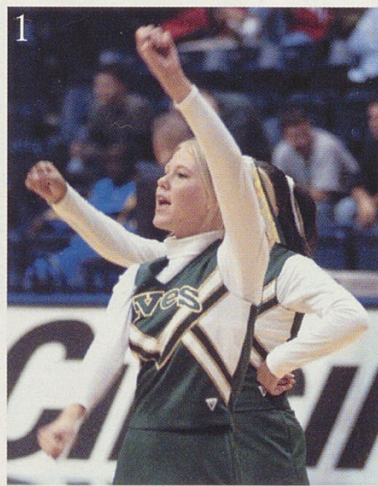
What is in your future?
