"The team played well, but I had to bust them to get where they were in the season," said Neeb.

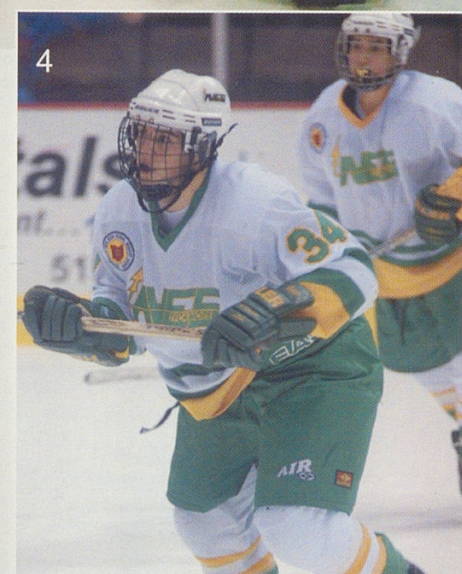
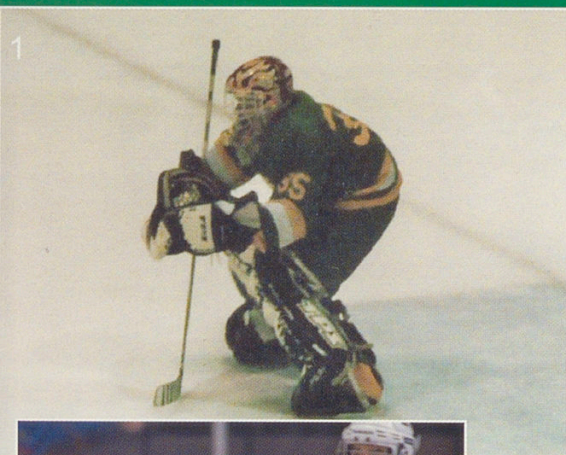
