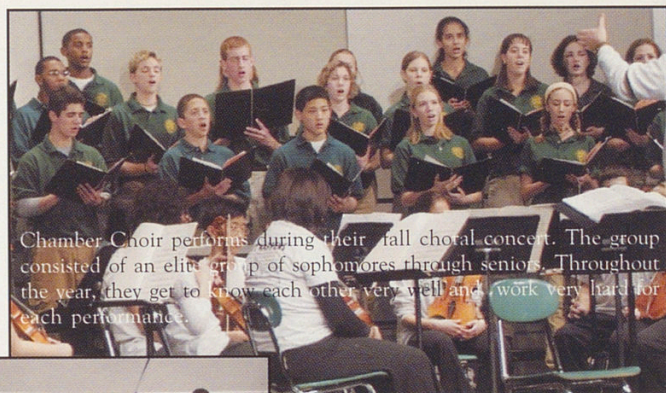

"I liked being in choir for the different opportunities it gave me," said **Sara Demuth, 12.**

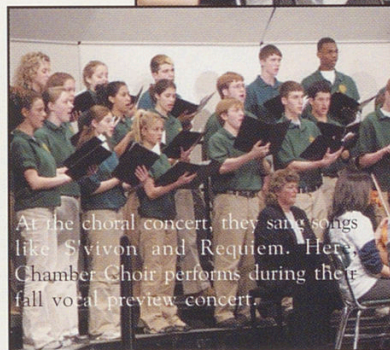
"Participating in the Chamber Choir was a lot of fun, but it also required a lot of hard work and dedication," said **Mayda Alemagno, 12.**

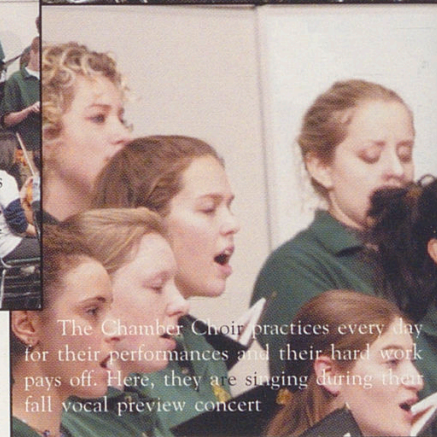

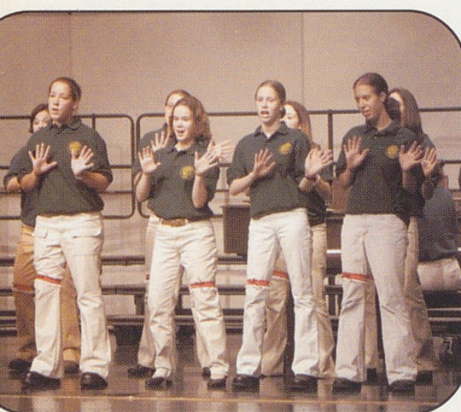


At the choral concert, they sang songs like S'vivon and Requiem. Here, Chamber Choir performs during their fall vocal preview concert.

"It was awesome to be a part of such an awesome group," said **Jessica Uchtman, 10.**

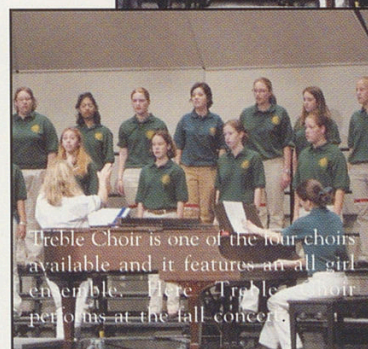
