The club does various activities when they meet while improving their French skills. It is also a chance to meet people and eat some good food after school.





Working together to complete a project during French Club, **Sophie Dream, 10, Jenny Breed, 11, and Lizzie**




During French Club, **Theresa Steinhardt, 10 and Jennifer Steinhardt, 10** help each other complete the activity.

Convention was also a great time for students. The O.J.C.L. Convention is held in Columbus.




We've got spirit. Latin Club members gather around their annual float in the Homecoming Parade.
