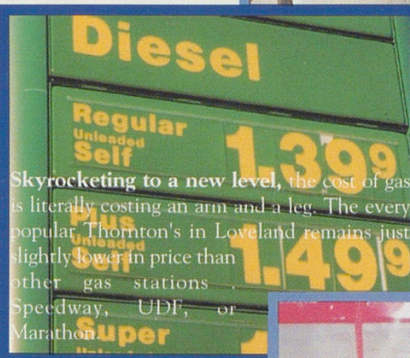

Back in my day ice cream cost a nickel... that's definitely not the case now, though teens aren't really spending their money on ice cream.

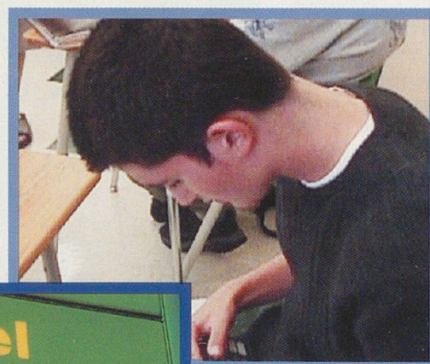
"I work every weekend at Skyline, so I can make money for college, and fun," said **Michael Shoeman, 11.**

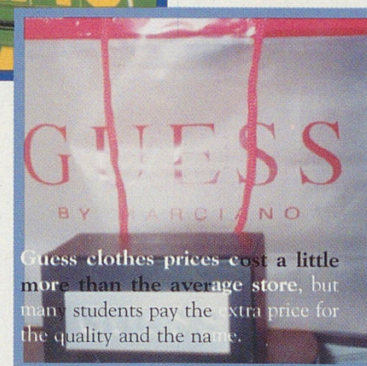
"I don't know what I'm going to do when my parents decide it's time to grow up, they pay for everything," said **Patrick Norwine, 9.**
