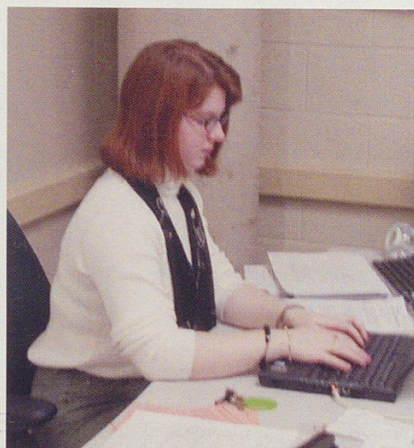
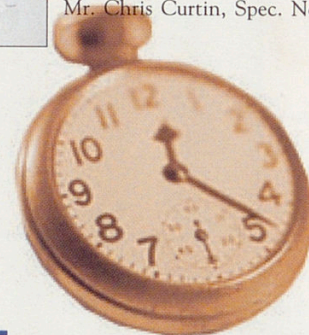

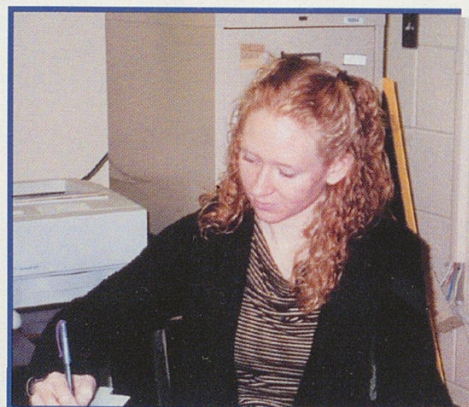
New Kids On The Block
