

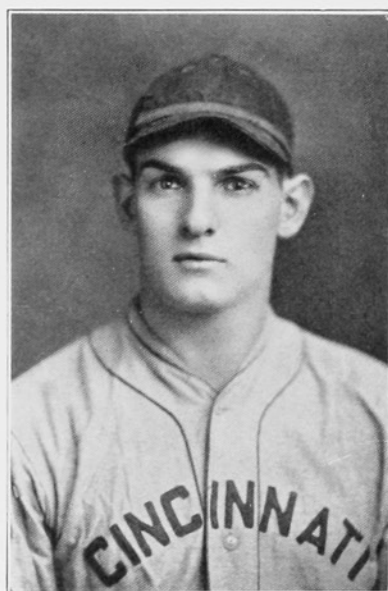
# Baseball



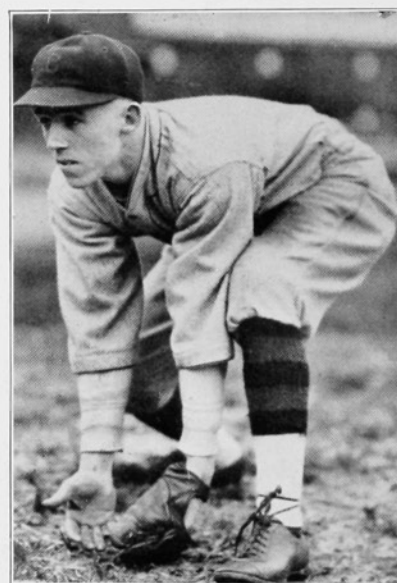
"COACH"
