THE next appearance of the Bearcats was much less encouraging and successful than the opener. Cincinnati played ragged ball and wasted whatever opportunities to score that they obtained. However, they were somewhat handicapped by the white stripes on the Kentuckians which made the white ball almost indistinguishable.

The only score of the game was produced by a forward pass which carried the ball to Cincy's two yard line from which it was a simple matter for Cunningham, Kentucky Wesleyan full-back, to buck the ball over the last white stripe. Outside of this score, the Kentuckians did not make much inroad against the Bearcat defense but it is necessary to make points in order to win football games and Varsity could not do this.

Cincinnati could not make any progress by straight football so they took to the air. However, all four men who attempted to play quarter-back made the fatal error of holding the ball long enough for the opponents to break through the line and tackle the supposed passer.
