THE followers of the Bearcat eleven expected the large score of the Wesleyan team against Cincinnati, but they were altogether unprepared for the result of the following game, a 65-0 defeat at the hands of Ohio University. Cincinnati was still suffering from the results of the previous struggle and put up their worst exhibition of the season. Only a flash of ability in the third quarter gave even a spark of hope, to the Red and Black machine.

The Bearcats showed no knowledge of even the fundamentals of the game in this contest. In the third quarter, a passing attack and a few good runs by Bursiek and Altick, took the ball to Ohio's five yard only to have these efforts repulsed by a fifteen yard penalty. After this the Bearcats never even threatened the Green and White defense.

McKinney led the Athenian defense and he received ample assistance from all the backfield men who played for Ohio. Hubley made his first real appearance at center and played a bangup defensive game while Fischer and Bursiek were a great factor in holding down the Ohio score by their work in bringing the Ohio men down. The Red and Black line offered practically no resistance to the fierce onslaught of the Bobcat attack so that the defense was largely dependent upon these backfield men.
