CINCINNATI, 0—DENISON, 9

ON the Annual Homecoming Day tussle, Denison extended their consecutive number of victories over the Bearcats to fifteen. The Bearcats outplayed the Baptists for a large part of the game but the old jinx was still working. The Baptists scored in the second quarter as a result of a 35 yard run by Pence and a few line bucks and off tackle plays. Shortly after the touchdown Denison again marched down the field but they were stopped on the 25 yard line. Gregory then dropped back and place kicked the ball straight between the goal posts for the visitor's other three counters.

Cincinnati staged a determined advance in the third quarter. However Sidingier crossed the goal line only to have the referee rule that he was pushed over the line and penalized the Red and Black fifteen yards. This penalty severely handicapped the Bearcats and dampened their ardor to the extent that they threatened the Baptists' goal line no more.

With the exception of the second quarter, the entire Cincinnati team put up an excellent game and showed a great improvement over their early season form. Fischer, Bohl, and Hallett were the main cogs in the improved play of the Bearcats.
