Football Resumé

THE poor record of the Bearcats this year was probably due to a great extent to the unusually strong schedule which the team tackled. Ohio Wesleyan, Dayton, Miami, and even Ohio University have been turning out teams which are far above the caliber of Cincinnati's average aggregation. However only the poor material of the squad this year can explain defeats at the hands of Transylvania, Kentucky Wesleyan, and Denison.

An exceptional forward pass attack seemed to be the only method by which Varsity could gain ground this year, and as a result this offense was exceedingly overworked and consequently proved of little avail when it was most needed. The line was outplayed in the great majority of the games and but for the fine defensive work of Fisher, Hallett, and Bursiek, the scores would have been much greater against the home team.

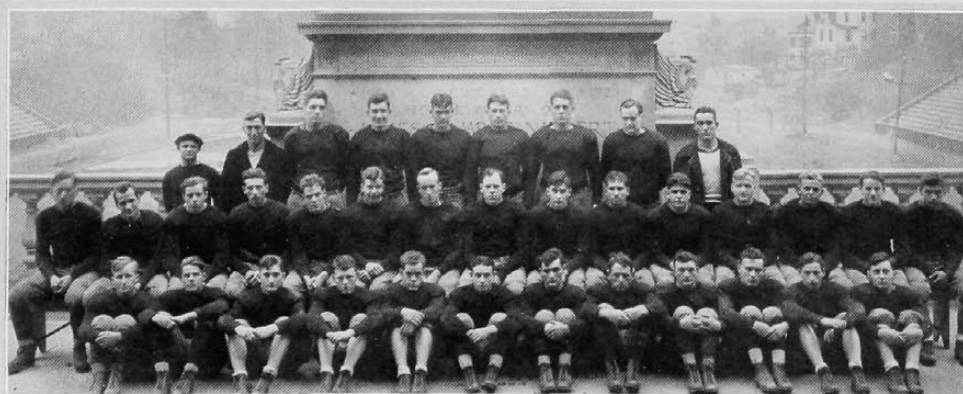
