Against Ohio Wesleyan, Cincinnati again made seven errors giving the Methodists an 8-1 lead. However, three runs in the seventh, two in the eighth and a homer with one on base by Dial in the ninth tied the score. The Bearcats won it out in the tenth. Langevin, Fischer, and Franz all saw service on the mound.

Wittenberg fell before Cincinnati by a score of 5-2 in a thrilling up hill struggle. Delaware, the scene of action, saw a terrible game from a scientific standpoint, but two homers by Dial brought home the bacon, 13-9. Langevin then won the Denison game from the mound. He struck out nine men in seven innings. Varsity came from behind to win, 10-5. Thus three Buckeye victories were won in five days on foreign fields, and only Miami remained between the Bearcats and the title.
