The first exhibition of the team at Nippert Stadium was the triangular meet with Miami and Ohio University. Miami easily won the meet with $88\frac{1}{2}$ points. Varsity followed with 43, and Ohio trailed with $31\frac{1}{2}$. The showing of Cincinnati in the distance events was very encouraging and surprising. Anderson won the mile and Crow the two mile. These were our only first places. However, on the strength of four seconds and some thirds, Cincinnati managed to finish second.

Varsity treked to Granville and returned with a 79-52 victory over Denison. Cincinnati made a clean sweep of two events and captured eight firsts and a tie for another. Vreeland was the high point scorer of the meet with firsts in the mile and half mile and a place on the winning relay team.

Miami made Cincinnati bite the dust by the overwhelming score of $101\frac{2}{3}$ to $29\frac{2}{3}$. Varsity did not take a single first although several of the races were decided by inches. In this meet Cincy's cinder path artists made their best records of the year only to have them bettered by their opponents. Barrows and Biggs ran the quarter in 51 seconds and Ehrensberger pole vaulted 11' 9".

In the Buckeye Intercollegiate Conference meet, Ohio Wesleyan and Miami fought out the championship between them, the former being victorious with 86 points to Miami's 76 $\frac{1}{2}$. Cincinnati finished fourth with 20 $\frac{2}{5}$ points due to eight fifth places and a third in the relay. Vreeland was the only Cincinnati man to finish above fourth with a fine victory in the half mile.

The Big Six meet ended a rather disastrous season. In this meet, Ohio Wesleyan again was victorious. Cincinnati scored only three points, a fourth in the relay, and Wettengel's fifth in the high hurdles.
