The Bearcats closed their Buckeye season by defeating Miami in the annual Decoration Day struggle at Oxford, Ohio. This victory put Cincy in a tie with Miami for the title-honors of the Buckeye Conference. Varsity was well on her way to winning the contest, but the Big Reds staged a magnificent rally in the ninth inning and knotted the count 2 all. In the tenth inning neither team could score, but in the eleventh stanza Si Kunz's single enabled Gervers to cross the plate with the winning tally.

Iowa University was the second Big Ten team to go down before the Bearcats this season. The final score was 6-7 with the Bearcats holding the slight margin.

In a post-season exhibition game at Oxford, Ohio, the Bearcats became the victims of Miami by losing 9-5 in a loosely played game. In the final game of the year Cincy downed Wooster College (undefeated Ohio Conference champions) by a score of 2-1.

With the Wooster game the Bearcats completed a very auspicious season, winning fourteen of twenty-two games. Of the ten Buckeye Conference games Varsity was victorious in eight. Injuries to six of the regulars handicapped the Bearcats to no small degree, and it was indeed fortunate that despite these injuries, these men were able to lend their aid in the Buckeye Conference contests.
