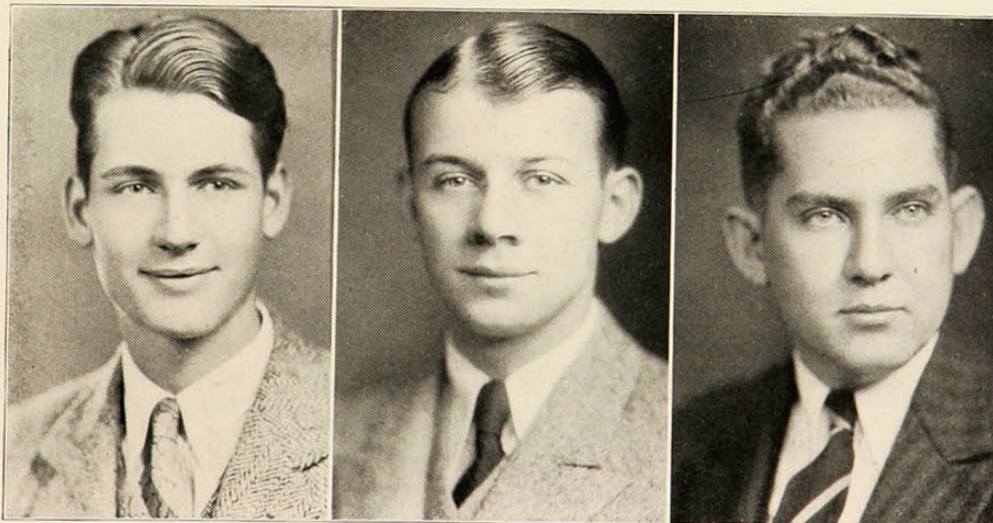

FOLLOWING up last year's fine record in the forensic art, the U. C. Debate Team of 1930 has already equalled the precedent set by their predecessors both in victories and in the calibre of their opponents.

Under the able leadership of the new coach, Arthur Postle, Loyola and Louisville, both able debating schools have been added to the schedule. Again about thirty debates have been engaged in by the Red and Black, and, in addition, several contests provided opportunity for the yearlings to try their speaking ability.

As regards the field of feminine endeavor, there has been a decided increase in the number of debates engaged in by girls' debating team. In these encounters, the girls have followed the example of the men in piling up decisions won from strong opponents.

The increased activity of both teams has been made possible largely through the increase in the budget allowed debating by this year's student council, and it is the hope of the debate council that this institution may never more languish for want of funds.
