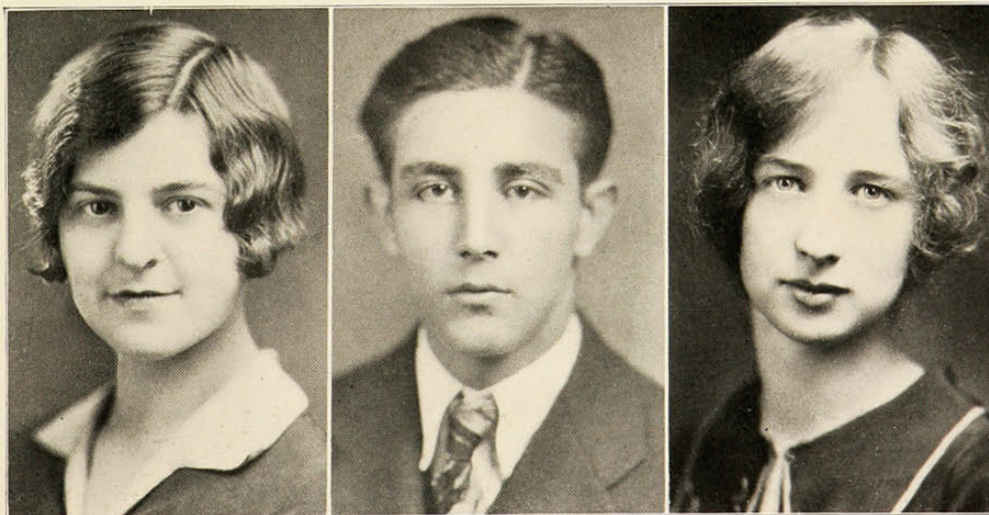

THE MENORAH SOCIETY of the University of Cincinnati, is a unit of the Intercollegiate Menorah Association of fifty-one societies in colleges and universities of the United States, Canada, and the British Isles. The Menorah movement had its inception at Harvard University in October, 1907. The local chapter has been active on the campus for the past fifteen years.

Menorah attempts to link the life of the Jewish student with the life of his elders, to parallel in the academic world the energetic trend outside the college walls. It is concerned with the creation, in the mind of the student, of an awareness of the Jewish spirit throughout history—and it also desires that this self-knowledge shall be not the possession of a few, but of the many, so that modern civilization may share more and more in the riches of the Jewish experience.
