lie the deep and abiding satisfactions of life.

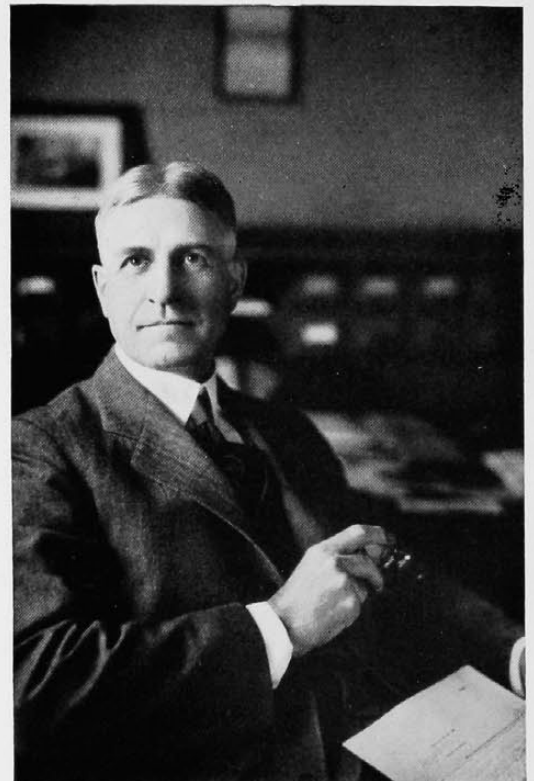
