

Publications

Although there is no College of Journalism at the University of Cincinnati, the journalistic field is well represented by the various publications which are controlled by the general student body. The Cincinnati, the University News and Bearcat, the Co-op Engineer, the Applied Arts Annual, and the New Collegian are representative of their own particular type of journalistic endeavor and worthy representatives of a great university.

The Cincinnati, official yearbook, makes its appearance during graduation week each year. It records the various important events of the scholastic year, the organizations on the campus, the senior class, and features which are characteristic of such a publication.

The University News and Bearcat is published bi-weekly. It embodies the important current news events, a sport page, editorials, and columns in which individuals express their beliefs and act as the exposers of all that is of general student interest. A training course is given each fall for those desiring minor staff positions. The principals are selected by a board of control.

The Co-op Engineer is the official publication of the College of Engineering and Commerce. It is published quarterly. The magazine is primarily for the promotion of interest in engineering fields but also contains features of Varsity life.

The Applied Arts Annual is published by the students of the College of Applied Arts. It contains the various drawings which exemplify the types of work carried out in that college. It is an extremely valuable book as viewed by the eyes of an artist.

The New Collegian made its first appearance at the University of Cincinnati at the beginning of this scholastic year. It is published primarily for the incoming Freshman class and explains the phases of college life and attempts to orientate the newcomers into the field of extra-curricular activities.
