The Bearcats kicked off to Wittenberg with a determination to regain the prestige lost the week before in the Denison game. Combining a strong defense with an offense that swept the Red Devils off their feet, the Kingmen made short work of the Wittenberg eleven. The Varsity line functioned perfectly, easily penetrating the visitors' defense to smear their plays for losses, and opening wide holes on the offense for long gains from Gilliland, Williams and Kaemmerle. The Red and Black forward wall with Parker, Hessel, and Carl Williams outstanding, afforded wonderful interference for Whitey Davis who exhibited championship form in pass receiving, pulling down Sidinger's heaves with un-failing accuracy. Davis' work accounted for many long gains.

Wittenberg was powerless to stop the aroused Bearcats from the outset of the tilt. Cincy's first score came early in the game when Gilliland crossed the scoring stripe after a series of end runs and plays through the center of the line. The Kingmen again chalked up a score in the final minutes of the half with a sustained 40-yard drive goalward. With the opening of the last half the 'Cats
