INFORMATION TO STUDENTS OF MEDICINE.

The session formally opens on the last Monday of October, annually, and closes on the last Saturday of February; but **DISSECTIONS**, under the direction of Dr. Trimble, and a preliminary course of **OSTEOLOGY**, by Professor McDowell, commence on the first Monday of that month, without any additional charge. Six Lectures are delivered daily, throughout the course. An hour, every other day, is devoted, by the Professors of the **PRACTICE OF PHYSIC** and of **SURGERY**, to the study of cases in the *Marine Hospital*, and the *Cincinnati Eye Infirmary*. All who intend to graduate, are required to take the Dissecting ticket once, and the Hospital ticket once,—the latter in the graduating session. It is optional with the student to take or omit the Library ticket. The price of the ticket of each Professor is \$15—Matriculation \$2—Dissections \$10—Hospital \$5—Library \$3—Graduation \$20. Two full courses, the last in this institution, or four years practice and one course, are necessary to an examination for a degree. A candidate must register his name with the Dean by the first of February, and hand in his Thesis by the 20th of that month. The examinations commence immediately after the Lectures terminate, and the public Commencement is held as soon as they are concluded.

The purchases of Professor Parker in Europe, and of Professor Rogers in Baltimore and Philadelphia, have greatly extended the **APPARATUS**, **MUSEUM**, and **LIBRARY** of the institution.

SUMMER INSTRUCTION.

At the close of the session, the rooms for Practical Anatomy are reopened by the *Demonstrator*, and kept open for a month. Students are likewise admitted to the practice in the Hospital, which is visited every morning for an hour, by two of the Professors.

Comfortable boarding and lodging may be had, at from \$2,50 to \$3,50 per week.
